

How Do You **Talk** to Your Own **Relatives** About **Spiritual** Things?

There is undoubtedly no greater burden on earth than to realize that individuals who are part of your family on earth may not become a part of your family in heaven. But how do you go about speaking to relatives about spiritual things, and specifically the gospel of Jesus Christ?

THE DON'TS

I. Don't be _____ by the _____.

- A. No one knows you like your relatives.

They have seen and know your past: your selfishness, fits of anger, unkind attitude, addictions to drugs, and a host of other sins.

Bear in mind that God forgives and you must forgive yourself. Personalize Psalm 103:12 by saying, "As far as the east is from the west, so far has He removed my transgressions from me."

- B. Satan is a _____. He loves to say, "What right do you have to talk to anyone? Remember when you used to. . ."

A forgiven person has both a right and responsibility to speak to anyone and everyone. When relatives have seen a change in your life, they are not likely to bring up the past. If they do, that becomes a bridge to the gospel. Lovingly say, "Please forgive me. It is because of who I used to be that I am delighted I've come to Christ. I wish somebody would have explained something to me sooner that I would like the opportunity to explain to you."

Matthew 10:34-36 "Do not think that I came to bring peace on earth. I did not come to bring peace but a sword. For I have come to set a man against his father, a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law.' And a man's foes will be those of his own household."

John 6:44 "No one can come to Me unless the Father who sent me draws him."

John 11:25-26 "Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?"

The question you therefore have for your relatives is "Have you come to a point in your life that you know beyond any doubt if you were to die you would go straight to heaven?"

Acts 14:1 "Now it happened in Iconium that they went together to the synagogue of the Jews, and so spoke that a great multitude both of the Jews and of the Greeks believed."
