Debris removal is ongoing. Most have electricity and some have internet access. The stores are open, and food is available in sufficient quantities to meet our needs.

We met with our insurance adjuster and are awaiting their crew coming to tarp the roofs for both buildings. The Activity Building took a major hit and some of the roof with its decking landed in the parking lot. Thanks to those who came out to cut this up and put it in the dumpster.

Please pray for everyone to have wisdom to know what to do next. We all need patience combined with perseverance. This will be a long haul, not a sprint.
